Composer

Alexander Glazunov was born in St Petersburg. He studied music under Nikolai Rimsky-Korsakov, and the first of his nine symphonies premiered in 1882 when he was 16 years old. His work started to become well known both in Russia and beyond, due partly to the advocacy of Franz Liszt.

Glazunov became a professor at the St Petersburg School of Music In 1899. He later became its director, where he remained until the events of 1917. After the end of World War I, he was instrumental in the reorganization of the Leningrad Conservatory.

Glazunov left Russia in 1928. He toured Europe and the United States, and settled in Paris. In 1929 Glazunov conducted an orchestra of Parisian musicians in the first complete electrical recording of The Seasons. He died at the age of 70.



Director of Photography

Gary Bush is an independent cinematographer, shooting regional and national commercials, documentaries, features, music videos and television shows. Various awards include a Best Cinematography Emmy for his work on "Join the Movement", a regional commercial for the Cincinnati Ballet. His non-fic-

tion work as director of photography on feature-length documentaries such as "Opening the Door West", along with other dramatic reenactments, can be seen on PBS, The Discovery Channel, The National Geographic Channel, Black Entertainment Television and Showtime.
